

Figure S2. Light microscopy of ashh2-1 mutant anthers immediately prior to dehiscence.

(A) ashh2-1 locule developing normally prior to anther opening, at the stage when the tapetal layer has been degraded in wt anthers. In some anthers of the ashh2-1 mutant the stomium splits (arrow) followed by pollen dehiscence. (B), (C) and (D) ashh2-1 locules with abnormal development, e.g. without any discernable organization and structure (arrow in B), with remains of the tapetum (T) (arrows in B and C), asynchronous development with some anthers showing advanced development, however with pollen with large levels of vesicles as seen in earlier stages (arrow in D).
