Supporting information S7: Study instruments and French translation sources

The Child Autism Rating Scale (CARS) was published in 1986 in an English version by Eric Schopler team (Schopler et al., 1986). It was translated into French by Bernadette Rogé and published in 1989. To our knowledge, there was no validation performed in French but the scale has been widely use in French and is recommended by the French regulatory authorities to assess patients with autism (HAS, 2012). The Autism Diagnostic Interview-Revised was published in 1994 by Lord et al. in 1994. The French version was translated by Bernadette Rogé, Eric Fombonne, Jeanne Fremolle-Kruck and Evelyne Arti. It is available through Hogrefe publisher that indicates that the validation was performed on a sample of 70 individuals. The Aberrant Behavior Checklist (ABC) has been used in several studies conducted by pharmaceutical companies on behavioral impairment in children and adolescent with autism or intellectual disability (Aman et al., 1985). Both Janssen (for risperidone studies) and Otsuka (for aripiprazole studies) have translated and validated the French version of the ABC. To our knowledge, validation have not been made publicly available. However, consistency of its value to show changes in behaviors with efficient treatment has been repetitively shown in both medication and behavioral studies including studies with French, Canadian, Swiss or Belgium sites (HAS, 2012). However, since 2005, a national prospective cohort has been promoted and longitudinal data are now available on ADI-R, CARS and ABC showing good descriptive values and high correlation between scores (Yanni-Coudurier et al., 2016). Finally, the Clinical Global Impression-Severity (CGI-S) and Clinical Global Impression-Improvement (CGI-I) scales have been used in many studies both in longitudinal studies and pharmacological trials. The French version was translated by Marc Ansseau in the 80ties (Guelfi et al., 1993).

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
